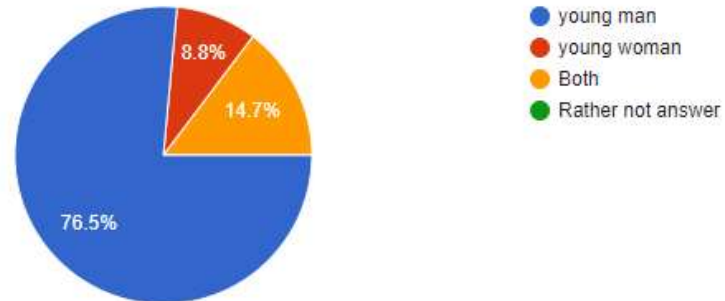

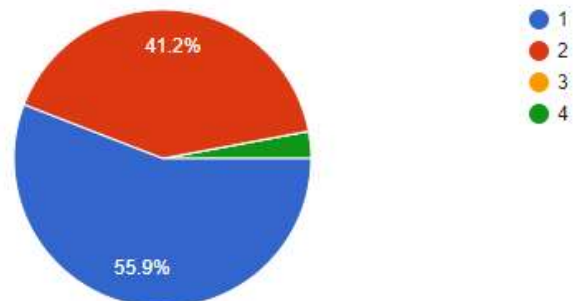

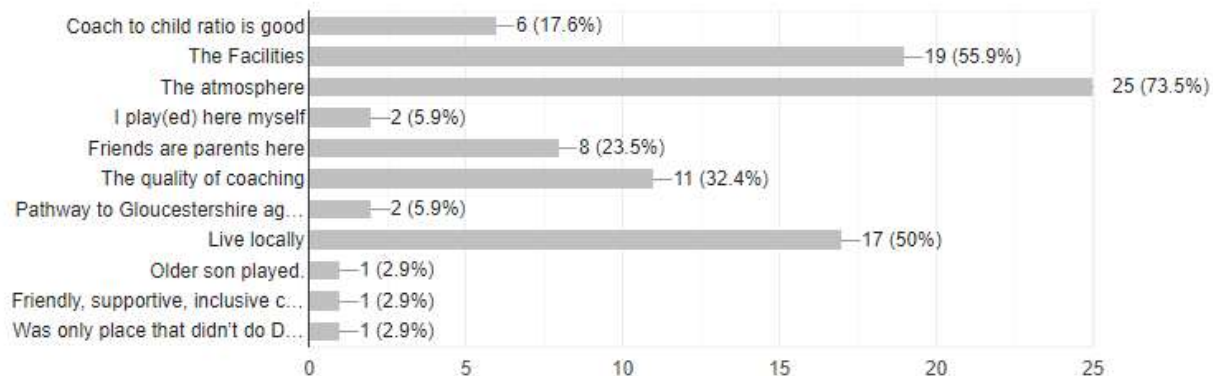

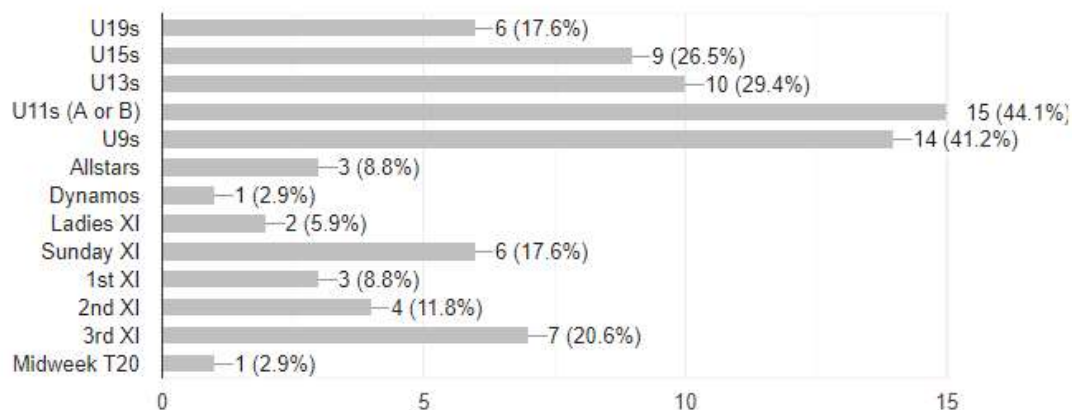
Why have you chosen Poulton for your Children? Tick any that apply

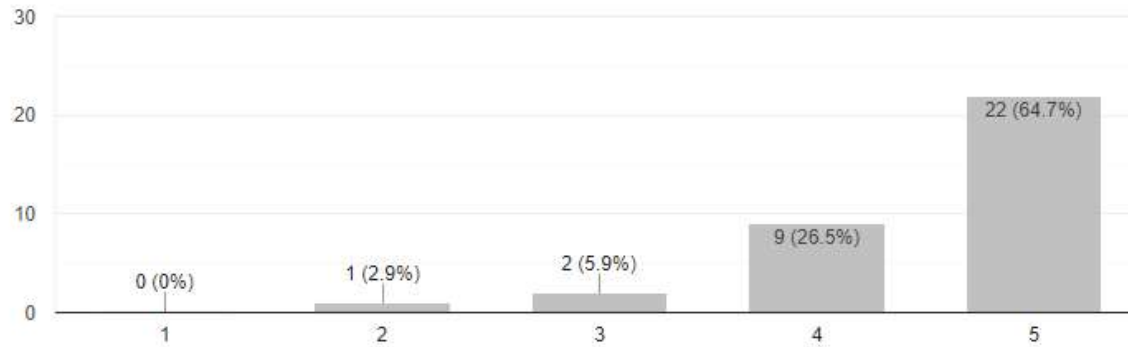

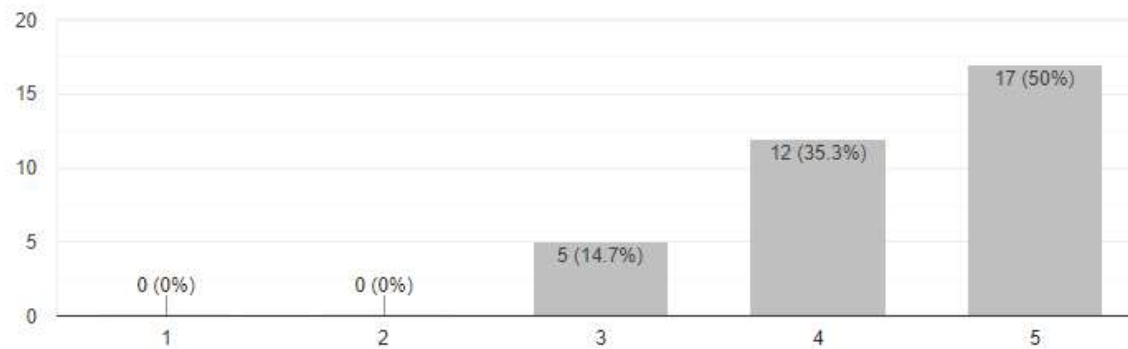
How have your child(ren) enjoyed the 2021 Season?

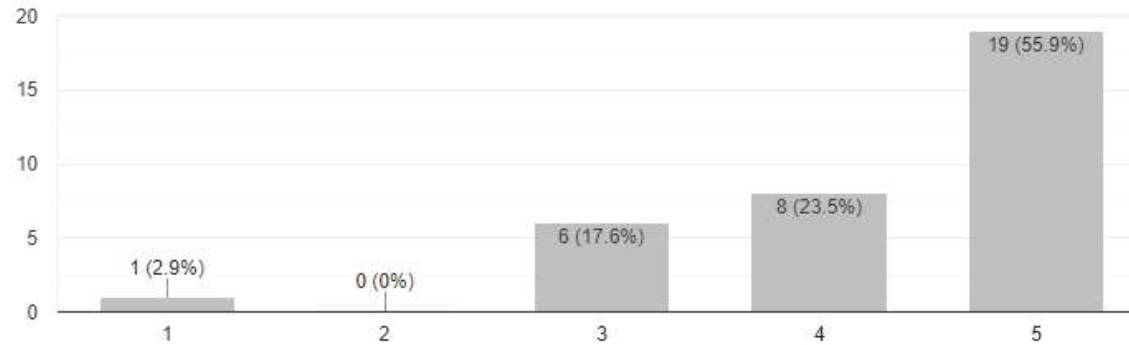

Overall how have you found the coaching we offered in 2021?

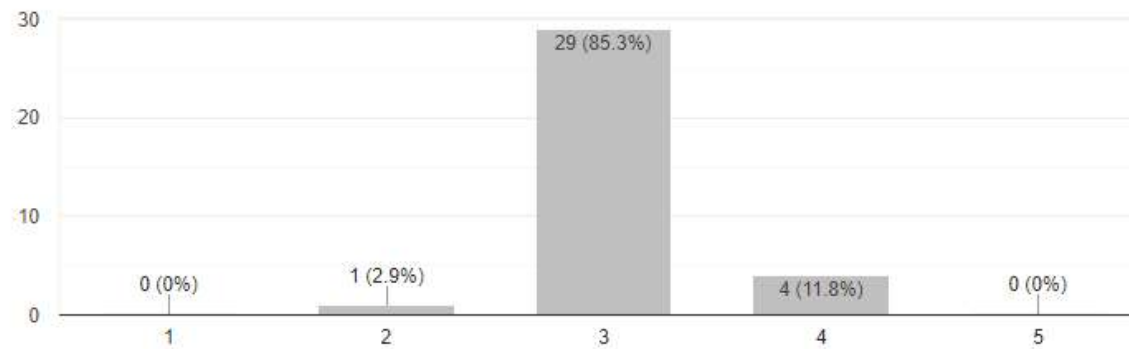

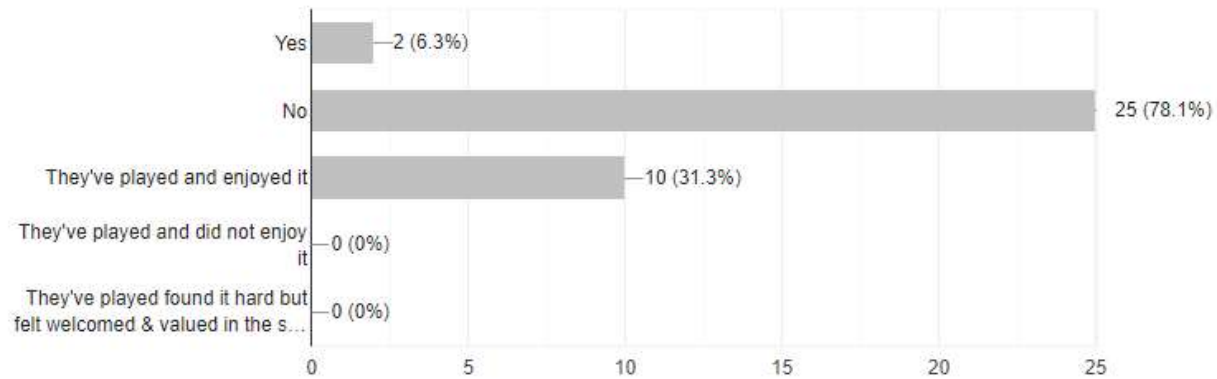

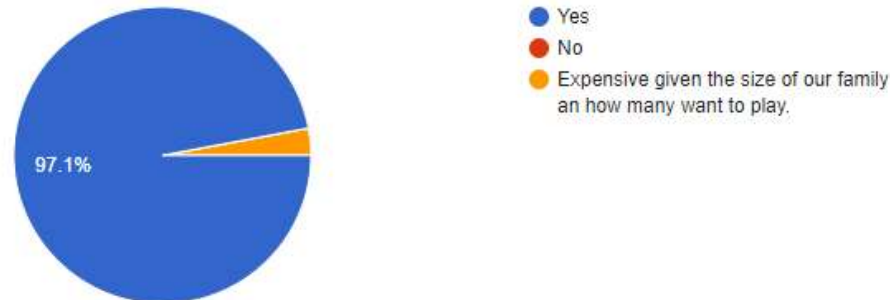
Do you have any concerns about your children playing in the senior club sides (eg Ladies, 1st, 2nd, 3rd XIs & Sunday XIs?)

This has been my sons first full season for Poulton. He has only had limited cricket experience before but absolutely loved this season. The club is inclusive to all and there is always the chance of playing whether in the u15s or in friendlies. Well done Poulton cricket club keep doing what you are doing.

We found this club by accident of Dynamo timing but now are happy we did. It has been welcoming and fun.

Your membership could be a lot more,

Too many Whatsapp messages. Otherwise excellent

We have found the season to be full of great, varied training sessions; plenty of chances for matches in a supportive environment. If I have any niggles for improvement I'd ask that there is greater fairness in decision making for batting order for the U13s as I found my son was always picked by the team captain as last or nearly last batsperson which affects the children's motivation and feeling as part of a team, particularly when the boys who are stronger cricketers all play together at school or district/county level so choose their friends over the less experienced members of the team. And I'd appreciate it if all coaches could be encouraged to model appropriate behaviours in front of the children that is fitting of safe/healthy decisions - smoking/vaping in clear sight of the children is not ideal modelling in my opinion and I'd prefer the children didn't see someone involved in coaching doing that (admittedly I only saw it at one game so may have been exceptional behaviour but would prefer it wasn't present during youth matches).

U13s squad would have benefitted from chance to gel as a group before games started and also more consistent comms to be aware of selection etc

Jody has been brilliant - so organised, efficient & supportive. Thank you!

The U15s really need a dedicated coach who can help in batting and bowling skills. Shame Liam is moving on, someone of his calibre needs to bring on the U15 age group.

Senior team attitude/games very positive and welcoming, with senior players taking an active role in development and inclusion of youth players. It would be good to see more senior players to attend Thursday training - as there are significant holes - particularly if the club is looking to create role models. Training has been a little ad hoc - some weeks there have been very focussed sessions, but others weeks it has been nets only. Both are helpful, but it would perhaps encourage more to attend if it was structured. Perhaps some focus on specific bowling/batting coaching would be of benefit.

The U19s season has been particularly poor. Match dates moved around a lot. Very few games were played. Limited opposition. U19s coaching was very disappointing. There was no coaching prior to the first match being played - resulting in a heavy defeat for which the coach berated the team. There was then possibly 2 x U19s coaching sessions - circuit training - but then these stopped without any communication to parents or players. Coach basically slated or ignored the team when they lost, and praised them when they won. The message was inconsistent and discouraging. Either we want to develop an U19 side, or we don't. We need to commit either way. If we do want an U19s side, then we need to create a team culture with clear communication of organisation.

We have a great club and we enjoy great participation in the younger age groups. The use of the nets for training has been an area where we can do better. It's unrealistic to have a net session for all the club when we have 2/3 nets. I think it would be better to have a specific night for the u15 - u19s so they can get some net time. It doesn't stop Then attending adult sessions but at least they have time to practice batting in the nets

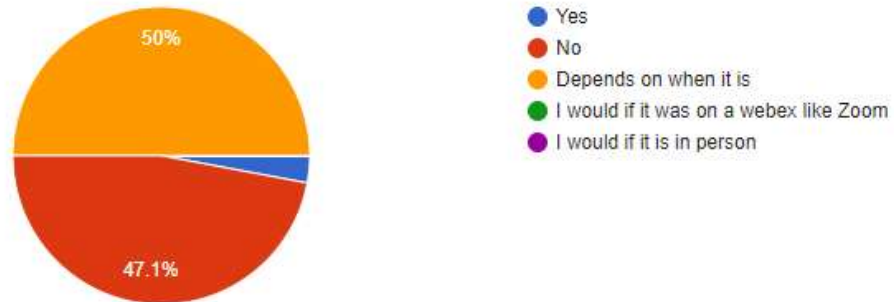

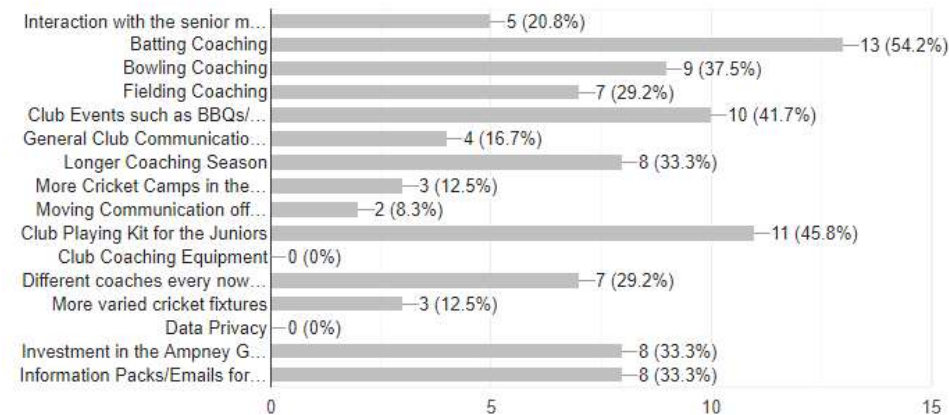

Important to keep the friendly, supportive atmosphere at Poulton. We feel very lucky to be part of the club in comparison to the coaching style seen at other matches (eg Cirencester).
